

16th year in a row FLGR consistently promotes, collects, publishes and widely disseminates innovative practices that foster ingenuity and exchange of experience among Bulgarian local governments and NGOs through its project "Innovative Practices in Bulgaria". Launched in September 1998, the project creates a sustainable model for the collection and dissemination of innovative practices in local government. Since the end of 2001 FLGR awarded local governments for being innovative in different

thematic areas, in the period of 2002 – 2009 – with the annual award "Innovative Municipality".

Online database of good practices in 2014 was enriched with 47 new practices.

The total number of published good practices since 1998, reached 1342 practices.

TRAININGS

The Centre for Training and Qualification within the Foundation for Local Government Reform was established in 2003 aiming at institutionalizing the training activities offered by FLGR.

>> Distance Learning

In 2014 the team of FLGR conducted 4 Internet-based training courses as part of the program MERI:

Combating poverty at the local level

The course consisted of three lectures and tests to them. The topics are as follows: Theme 1. Measures for social protection and assistance to individuals and families with low and / or no income. Social services; Theme 2. European and national policies for combating poverty and social exclusion; Theme 3. Policies for promotion of social entrepreneurship in the European context.

48 participants joined the course - 35 participants successfully completed it and were certified.

Integration of Roma in Bulgaria in the field of education

The course consisted of five lectures and tests to them. The topics were follows: 1. Introduction to human rights; 2. Legal basis for the integration of Roma in Bulgaria; 3. Access to education for Roma in Bulgaria; 4. Strategies and Policies for educational integration; 5. Institutions at local level that define and enforce policies for education.

Out of 67 participants in the course successfully completed it 57 and were certified.

Citizen participation in local government. Development of partnership with Roma NGOs and activating the local community

The course consisted of three lectures and tests them. The topics were follows: 1. Development of partnership with NGOs and strengthening community; 2. Principles of good governance at the local level; 3. Roma NGOs working in cooperation with local authorities to resolve the problems of Roma communities.

Out of 56 participants 43 successfully completed the course and were certified.

Planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of comprehensive integration policies

The course consisted of two lectures and tests to them. The topics were follows: 1. Planning of comprehensive integration policies; 2. Implementation, monitoring and evaluation of comprehensive integration policies.

Out of 98 participants 72 successfully completed the course and were certified.

Participants in the courses were local municipal experts, representatives of municipal institutions, community centers, academics from across the country. Successful graduates of the courses received certificates.



MERI Bulgaria Mayors Making the Most of EU Funds for Roma Inclusion Network

FLGR participated in the realization of MERI Bulgaria 2014. The initiative Mayors Making the Most of EU Funds for Roma Inclusion Network (MERI) aimed to promote social inclusion and Roma integration through sharing of best practices and training in European countries, as well as highlighting the achievements at local level.

Partners of MERI Bulgaria were the Open Society Institute, Sofia, the National Association of Municipalities in Bulgaria and the organization of European cities Eurocities.

The successful MERI Bulgaria 2013 was extended in 2014. In the framework of the initiative there was an exchange of experience between Bulgarian municipalities and European cities with large number of immigrants from these communities, study tours, trainings, issuing information materials and holding of thematic informational events,

Responsibility of FLGR was the information outreach, creation and maintaining an active facebook page **https://www.facebook.com/MeriBulgaria**, online library, a regular section in the e-Weekly, as well as holding four distance online trainings (see above).

COMPUTERS FOR INSTITUTIONS AND ORGANIZATIONS IN SMALL <u>SETTLEMENTS</u>

In 2014, similar to 2013, FLGR logistically supported the initiative of the Swiss Agency for Cooperation and Development and the Swiss Embassy in Sofia to provide computer and office equipment to organizations and institutions from small cities in the country.

In response to the stated needs 268 workstations, laptops, printers and servers were provided to municipalities, NGOs, community centers, kindergartens, academic institutions, hospitals.



PROMOTING CITIZEN PARTICIPATION IN THE FORMULATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF POLICIES FOR REGIONAL AND LOCAL DEVELOPMENT



In November 2014 FLGR in cooperation with Mysya Regional Association for Development and Innovation started work on the project "Promoting citizen participation in the formulation and implementation of policies for regional and local development".

Inclusion of civil energy in the formulation and implementation of the policies for regional and local development is key to the improving the quality of life, poverty reduction, social inclusion and access to basic services.

The objective of the project is s to ensure the effective involvement of citizens and their organizations in the process of formulation and implementation of policies for regional and local development.

Specific objective of the project is to improve citizen capacity and create well functioning forms for real participation of citizens and their organizations in the process.

Realization plans include the achievement of more citizens' knowledge and skills, creation of appropriate legislative and institutional framework for civic participation and securing of support of all levels.

The main results of the project will be an analysis of the obstacles to the citizen participation in regional and local policy, elaboration of recommendations for legislative and institutional changes, creation and verification of a mechanism for citizen participation in policies for regional and local development, thematic training, supportive public campaign.

Target groups of the project are decision-makers in the sphere of regional and local development at national, regional, district and municipal level, public officials and civil society organizations.
